## INTRODUCTION

---

2007-08 marked the ACAC's 43<sup>rd</sup> year of service in the provision of competitive post - secondary sport opportunities for Alberta's ever expanding college student population. From its humble beginnings in 1964, when five member institutions fielded men's basketball teams in the former Western Inter-College Conference, the ACAC boasted seventeen member institutions in 2007-08. College athletes competed in thirteen athletic activities. The number of annual ACAC participants has correspondingly increased from approximately 50 in 1964-65 to 1,804 in 2007-08. During the course of its existence, the ACAC has positively impacted the lives of over 32,000 individuals by fostering a climate of growth, development and education through competitive sport. Ultimately, many of these ACAC graduates became valuable leaders in the framework of Alberta sport.

By virtue of the fact that ACAC teams and individuals have won more medals than any other provincial college athletic conference in Canadian College Athletics Association (CCAA) national championship competitions, the ACAC is widely regarded as the pre-eminent college athletic conference in Canada. Moreover, over the course of the past year, the Conference has intentionally addressed this goal in review with an eye to maintaining that pre-eminent position into the future! Alberta's post-secondary student athletes are fortunate to have the opportunity to pursue their academic and athletic aspirations at the finest collection of post secondary institutions assembled in any Canadian province.

The Conference is thankful for the support offered by many "partners", most notably the Alberta Sport, Recreation, Parks and Wildlife Foundation and the Alberta Heritage Scholarship Fund, Alberta Government departments who support financially a large measure of our Conference operations through operational grants and scholarships.

This annual report chronicles the activities and results of the Alberta Colleges Athletic Conference during the period of July 1, 2007 through to June 30, 2008. Key developments and activities are described in the "2007-08 in Review" section which follows this introduction and in the Executive Reports found in Appendix I. Appendix II contains the statistical story of 2007-08.

2007 – 2008 in Review

---

 MEMBERSHIP

The number of participating institutions in the ACAC grew to sixteen in 1996-97 with the admission of Briercrest Bible College and The King's University College into the Conference. Briercrest Bible College, located in Caronport, Saskatchewan, was granted "guest playing privileges" and became the first non-Alberta institution to compete in the ACAC. BBC Clipper teams competed in the ACAC's South Division men's and women's basketball and volleyball. The College amended its name to Briercrest College (BC) in 2005. The King's University College, in Edmonton, joined the ACAC's North Division, competing in men's and women's basketball only in 1996-97. In 1997-98, both colleges increased their participation with BBC joining men's hockey and TKUC joining men's and women's volleyball in the North Division. Grant MacEwan Community College also joined men's hockey for the 1997-98 season; Concordia University College of Alberta joined women's and men's basketball in 1999-00 and Portage College joined men's and women's volleyball in 2001-02. Olds College rejoined the ACAC as a guest member in 2001-02 in sports of golf and curling after a seven year absence. The University of Calgary joined in 2002-03 as a guest member in golf and women's hockey while The King's University College and Keyano College joined competition in soccer. Lakeland College joined ACAC competition in basketball in 2003-04. Finally, Grande Prairie Regional College joined the Conference soccer ranks in 2004-5.

The seventeen institutions who participated in the 2007-08 regular season included fifteen private and/or public colleges and two technical institutes. Three institutions were officially designated as university colleges and are among eleven ACAC institutions which have full degree granting status. Furthermore, fourteen institutions were categorized as "full" members of the Conference, one was classified as an "associate" member and two were "guest" members. The number of activities into which an institution chooses to enter determines membership status. The primary advantage to institutions competing in a greater number of activities, and thus holding full membership status, is the privilege of appointing two voting delegates to the Conference Council, the association's main decision-making body. Associate members are accorded only one voting delegate whereas guest members or institutions that enjoy guest playing privileges are entitled to have speaking privileges but no vote at Conference Council meetings. Associate member Prairie Bible College announced their withdrawal from the Conference prior to the 2005 AGM.

Historically, new inquiries about membership were received in 1996-97 from Flathead Community College in Montana and the College of the Rockies in Cranbrook, B.C. Both of these colleges were informed that the ACAC Conference Council had placed a three-year moratorium (ended in June 2000) on new membership in order to allow the Conference to sufficiently adjust to its most recent expansion. In 1998-99, the ACAC office received new inquiries from Fairview College and Olds College (Olds College is a former member of the ACAC). During the 1999-00 term, St. Mary's College in Calgary and Northwest Bible College in Edmonton inquired about future membership. In 2000-01, Fairview College and Northwest Bible College, again, showed interest but did not

make application to join. Subsequently, new inquiries were received from Northern Lakes College (Slave Lake), Muskwachees Cultural College (Hobbema), as well as the three Alberta Universities (U of A, U of C and U of L). Olds College made a formal application and joined the ACAC as a guest member for 2001-02 in the sports of golf and curling.

During the past four years, membership enquiries were received from St. Mary's College in Calgary and Taylor University (formerly North American Baptist College) in Edmonton. The moratorium on participation was lifted at the May 2006 AGM and new applications were accepted in fall 2006. Portage College submitted a bid to add Men's Hockey to their program and Medicine Hat College applied to have Golf added. At the May 2007 AGM both programs were voted in by Council. The Golf team at Medicine Hat College will enter play in the 2007-08 season and the Portage College Men's Hockey is scheduled to begin league play in the 2008-09 season.

## ADMINISTRATION

The governance and management of the ACAC was efficiently undertaken during the 2007-08 season by an ACAC Executive Committee which included President Dr. Ellery Pullman (Briercrest), Vice President, Operations Wade Kolmel (Keyano), Vice President, Finance Leigh Goldie (GPRC), Vice President, Marketing Kelly Almer (Medicine Hat College) and Member-at-Large Avery Harrison (SAIT). This Committee met on eight occasions between July 1, 2007 and June 30, 2008. Office staff included Executive Director Dr. Robert D. Day, Executive Assistant Erin Cameron and Technical Assistant Anthony Wong. Erin, Anthony and Bob provided daily professional support to the membership from the ACAC Office. Bill Hendsbee completed his second term in the office of ACAC Commissioner.

The ACAC Conference Council met on three occasions during the 2007-08 academic year. A two-day planning meeting was held at the Conference host hotel, the Best Western Village Park Inn in Calgary in September. A four-day strategic planning meeting was held at the Sutton Place Hotel in Edmonton in December. The AGM, consisting largely of a business meeting, was held over four days at Chateau Suites, in Sylvan Lake from May 5<sup>th</sup> – 8<sup>th</sup> 2008.

Once again, the Conference was able to achieve a high percentage of the objectives set out for itself in 2007-08 and re-oriented several of the major functions within the office.

## FINANCES

ACAC Vice President, Finance Leigh Goldie supervised the day to day transactions undertaken by Executive Director Bob Day. Together, these individuals capably managed the finances of the ACAC and provided updated information to the membership to enable the Conference to assess the financial status of the ACAC in a more well-informed fashion. An external review of the ACAC's 2006-07 financial records was undertaken and completed by the accounting firm of Peterson Walker in the summer of 2007. Peterson Walker will be contracted to perform a review of the ACAC's 2007-08 financial records in the late summer of 2008. A significant change in the management of the ACAC's financial accounting records took place in 1996-97 with the

employment of Elvi Clark as the ACAC's off-site office accounting consultant. On a monthly basis, Ms. Clark reviews all financial transactions into a Simply Accounting program and produces the monthly and year-end financial reports.

The Alberta Sport, Recreation, Parks and Wildlife Foundation provided the ACAC with a grant of \$163,300.00 for the 2007-08 year. As noted above, this grant is extremely important in helping to reduce ACAC assessments to the individual colleges.

At year-end, the ACAC's overall financial situation resulted in a modest operating surplus intended to augment the Conference reserve which had fallen substantively during the years 2000 to 2003. The goal of the Conference is to establish a financial stabilization fund amounting to two years of ASRPWF grant monies, or \$326,600, with the condition that the funds may only be accessed with Council approval. The intent of the fund is to provide the Conference with a two year period of stable funding should the ASRPWF grant be withdrawn. All operating surpluses are invested into low risk investments which provide protection for the ACAC in the event of any future catastrophic financial crisis.

The significant financial review completed during 2002-3 was intended to avoid future deficits after three consecutive years of deficit budgeting. Notwithstanding these deficits, the Conference presented net assets approximating \$ ,000 at year end, compared to \$246,000 the previous year! Subsequent to this review, the Conference is now committed to realizing modest surpluses annually until the reserve target amount is realized. This shall be managed by presenting conservative budgets which shall be balanced through the adjustment of membership fees. At the same time, the Conference remains committed in its search for possible marketing revenues, now . The Conference Council elected to implement a three year advance budgeting process in order to attempt to strategically plan for upcoming fiscal changes. This process continues in view of increasing inflationary challenges.

## PARTICIPATION AND COMPETITION RESULTS

In 2007-08, a total of 1,804 male and female athletes competed in twelve sanctioned league or tournament sports. A breakdown of participation by sport, gender and institution can be examined in Table 3 of Appendix II. Final college placements in all activities are located in Table 4 of Appendix II.

Once again, ACAC teams were considered amongst the finest in Canada. For complete CCAA Championship results, see Table 11 of Appendix II.

## INDIVIDUAL HONOURS AND AWARDS

Sixteen ACAC athletes were distinguished as CCAA All-Canadians in their respective sports for the 2007-08 season (see Table 12 Appendix II). In addition, 36 athletes were named CCAA Academic All-Canadians, an award which recognizes those student-athletes who combine athletic and academic excellence (see Table 16 of Appendix II). ACAC athletes truly symbolize the ACAC motto of *"Building Character Through Athletic and Academic Achievement"*.

Other CCAA awards featured in this publication include ACAC athletes chosen as tournament all-stars at the CCAA National Championships (Table 13) and the CCAA Athletes of the Month (Table 14) selected from the ACAC.

Tables 4 through 8 list the recipients of individual ACAC Awards in 2007-08. These tables include the 2 ACAC Athletes of the Year (Table 5), the 18 ACAC Players of the Year (Table 6), the 182 All-Conference Award recipients (Table 7), the 19 ACAC Coaches of the Year (Table 8) and the 329 ACAC Academic Athletic Award recipients (Table 9).

## FINANCIAL AID TO ATHLETES

Financial aid received by ACAC athletes through the Jimmie Condon Scholarship program administered by the Alberta Heritage Scholarship Fund totaled close to \$1.8 million for the 2007-08 activity year. A complete scholarship breakdown by sport and institution is located in Table 17 of Appendix II.

The ACAC would like to acknowledge the significant financial support provided by the Alberta Heritage Scholarship Fund through the Jimmie Condon Scholarship program.

### A SUMMARY OF KEY ACAC DEVELOPMENTS IN 2007-08

- Two ACAC member institutions hosted CCAA National Championships in 2007-08 as Grande Prairie Regional College was host of the 2007-8 CCAA Cross-Country Running Championships in November and Mount royal was host to the Women's Volleyball Championships in March.
- The financial foundation of the Conference was assured once again by the Alberta Sport, Recreation Parks & Wildlife Foundation by their contribution of a grant in the amount of \$163,300 for the administration of college sport in Alberta.
- The Conference introduced an exciting sponsorship program with the introduction of the ACAC Championships Partners Program (CPP). The CPP was highlighted by the partnership with **ATB Financial** who became involved as the Program's inaugural Presenting Partner.
- **Subway** concluded an ninth year of a generous program of support for ACAC athletics. The program included the sponsorship of Athlete of the Week awards (6' party subs), two \$1,000 ACAC Player of the Year Scholarships and \$2,000 cash subsidies to each member college.
- **adidas, Sher-Wood Hockey and Elite Sportswear** of Edmonton continued to support the Conference through "in kind" sponsorship and in the case of the latter two, \$500 scholarships for our top hockey and basketball players. **adidas** assumed the title sponsorship of the ACAC Soccer Championships.

- **Konica Minolta** remained as an ACAC sponsor, providing two plain paper fax machines for use at the ACAC office and the Commissioner's office, a photocopy machine for the ACAC office and two, \$500 scholarships for our top volleyball players.
- **eurosport** became the new presenting sponsor of the ACAC Women's and Men's Soccer Championship Player of the Game awards and provided two, \$500 scholarships for the top two soccer players.
- The Conference introduced new two year agreements with 10 hotel properties as host hotels for the next two seasons.
- In December, 2007 launched an internal governance review resulting in the formation of a Task Force mandated to review how the Conference governs itself with an eye to (1) becoming more administratively efficient and (2) preparing a portal for the future growth and development of the Conference into the 21<sup>st</sup> Century.
- The ACAC Outlook Newsletter, previously distributed three times a year, continued as a monthly electronic newsletter that was sent out to members in the Conference as well as high schools in Alberta and Saskatchewan.
- The Conference approved membership for Portage College Men's Hockey. At the same time, the Conference tabled a membership application from Keyano College in Women's and Men's Basketball subsequent to an Executive review in the spring of 2009. The ACAC accepted the withdrawal of Portage College volleyball (temporary) and discontinued the sport of swimming owing to insufficient college membership.

## **President's Report**

It is my pleasure to bring you a brief report of the activities and accomplishments attained during this past season of ACAC athletics.

At the outset I want to express my sincere thanks to the Executive Committee, Bob Day our Executive Director and the Council as a whole for your tireless efforts over this past year. I also want to thank our Commissioner, Bill Hendsbee, for the counsel and guidance provided and the many rulings he has been involved in making over the past season of competition. Bill has served our conference with both diligence and excellence. Thanks as well needs to be extended to Erin and Anthony for their contributions to our day to day office operations.

I want to applaud both Grand Prairie and Mount Royal College for the outstanding jobs they did in hosting the CCAA National Championships for Cross Country Running and Women's Volleyball respectively. Well done!

I also want to recognize the efforts of Kelly Almer [VP Marketing] and Bob Day for their efforts in establishing our Championship Partners Program which has garnered extra funding for the Conference. As many of you know and can appreciate, finding new sources of funding is always a difficult task and these gentlemen have done a great job this past year on behalf of the Conference.

A year ago the Council agreed there was a need to revisit our governance, vision, values and mission perspectives as they related to our Conference operations. We spent time in December 2006 during our planning days, as well as in May, 2007 at our AGM looking at our core values, processes of communication, succession planning as well as taking time to glance into our preferred future as an organization. This past fall we took another step in the process by reviewing various matters related to organizational governance. Following our December, 2007 Planning Meeting a Governance Task Force was established to move this conversation forward.

We have also faced some challenges on various levels as it pertains to day to day operations of the Conference. Some of these challenges have been the result of inappropriate conduct of coaches and fans, unethical recruiting practices and at times a lack of concerted leadership on the part of some athletic directors. Our growing diversity as an athletic conference has also posed some challenges for us. Dealing with the various challenges before us will call for renewed efforts on everyone's part as we seek to make decisions that will result in "best practices" for the Conference as a whole.

We remain committed to both academic and athletic excellence for our athletes in hopes that they will see in each of us an example of what we hope they will become as a result of being involved in ACAC athletics.

## Executive Director's Report Dr. Robert Day

---

The ACAC has completed its 43<sup>rd</sup> year of competition with several new faces around the Conference Council table and has rendered exceptional competition and some fine results at the CCAA national championships. Congratulations to our medalists and to all those who have achieved academic laurels. Congratulations too to GPRC for their fine hosting of the CCAA National Cross-Country Running National Championships and to Mount Royal College for a fine job of hosting the 2008 CCAA Women's Volleyball Championships!

The year was marked by significant controversy in a number of areas including use of ineligible athletes, the CCAA 5<sup>th</sup> year eligibility issue, improper recruiting practices, the discontinuation of one ACAC sport (swimming) and the unexpected discontinuation of one ACAC sport participant – GPRC in badminton. In addition, the UofC announced that the 2008-9 season would be the final year of Dinos' women's hockey participation in the Conference. During 2007-8, the workload of the Commissioner, Bill Hendsbee, was significant. The year was also unusual owing to the unexpected absence of Executive Assistant E. Cameron from the ACAC Office for two weeks during the critical September period owing to illness and sick leave at the end of her contract period during the final stages of pregnancy and the absence for five months of President E. Pullman owing to illness as well.

There have been a number of other significant things that have occurred to date this year:

**Conference Governance:** As a natural sequence to our strategic planning work over the past couple years and with associated reference to my 2006-7 evaluation, we were pleased to invite President Tom Thompson of Olds College to lead us in a review and reconsideration of our Conference management style. Following Dr. Thompson's presentation to Council Dec. 11, he met with the eight member Governance Review Task Force (E. Pullman, K. Almer, B. Dean, L. Goldie, W. Kolmel, M. Kosak, A., Rogan, R. Day) Jan. 25 at Olds College. The Task Force met again Feb. 22 in Red Deer and at the Percy Page Centre April 18. It is expected the Task Force will present to Council a recommendation at the AGM.

**Operating Code Review:** This project, requested by myself via ad hoc committee study in 2004, finally was completed by myself as a summer project in 2007 and recommended changes were approved by Council in September. During the course of working with the OC during the past year, it might be advisable to review the document again this summer to take a second look. No major changes are envisioned although certain changes, such as the volleyball divisional format change, should be included.

**Marketing:** Under to hands-on leadership of Kelly Almer, the Marketing Committee has demonstrated leadership in meeting as a committee via conference call on a regular basis throughout the year. The results have been dramatic. Included among the Committee's innovations are the implementation of the CPP, the ACAC Visual Identity Guidelines and the introduction of the now annual Event Coordinators' Meeting in conjunction with the AGM.

I am pleased in several sponsorship initiatives which have resulted in improved support for the Conference. Most notable are the introduction of the ATB sponsorship through the CPP (\$25,000) and

the near doubling of the Subway agreement (to \$65,000) in which members participating in the Subway program will see their returns doubled. In addition, we were able to re-negotiate the Sher-Wood Hockey agreement for another three years with a guarantee all members would receive equal benefit provided they remained in Conference hockey for the duration of the agreement.

**Championship Partners Program:** You have already received and discussed in September this new program which has seen the Conference realize \$26,000 in additional sponsorship revenues during the course of the year. While I am pleased with the initial success of the program. I am disappointed I have not been able to add to it during the academic year. The sheer volume of Conference management business has precluded me from finding focused time to allot to marketing initiatives and the couple "cold calls" I have made have been unsuccessful. The Report for the 2007-8 program is available at the AGM for your perusal.

I can report that ATB is pleased with their involvement in the program thus far and at time of writing, every indication is that they shall re-up in some form for 2008-9. They will look to become even more involved in the "big 3" championships, as they call them . . . BB, VB and hockey. They expect to do more "in venue" promotions and half time type give-aways.

Whether or not our current staffing and job descriptions will allow us to pursue this program effectively remains in doubt. This is a question which the Governance Review Task force has broached and which the Council may wish to consider more seriously in the future.

**New Applications:** Over the past several months an ad hoc Applications Review Committee (K. Almer, K. Karch. R. Day) have been reviewing an application from Keyano College to participate in women's and men's basketball. As you note in the recommendation, the committee is not prepared to endorse the application at this time.

**Fiscal Situation:** The Conference continues to find itself in a solid fiscal position. VP Finance L. Goldie reported in December that operations were proceeding as planned and that he expected the Conference to make a substantive payment into the Reserve Fund in January (including repaying a \$50,000 loan made to the operational budget in spring, 2006 when the Conference was between casino funds). At time of writing, the Reserve Fund stands at \$226,209.05 or 69% of the Council-indicated two year ASRPWF grant reserve (\$326,600) to cover the Conference for a two year period in the event provincial government funding is withdrawn.

**Conference Workbook:** At the request of the Executive Committee, the Conference has initiated the use of a Workbook to organize business related to the upcoming AGM. The notion of a workbook was first introduced by the ACAC Office several years ago and this document has been compiled by Executive Assistant E. Cameron. The intent of the Executive is that the application of a workbook format will ensure everyone has familiarized themselves with issues prior to the meeting thereby ensuring that business moves more efficiently at the meeting itself. Yet to be determined is whether or not the workbook format should be used for the December meeting as well. Members are thanked for their attention to this process insofar as it was introduced with minimal response time. Thank you for your contributions.

**Jimmie Condon Scholarships:** [There have been no further developments on the Jimmie Condon front. Alberta Scholarship's Stuart Dunn indicated recently the current Student Finance Board](#) is again seeking a new Chairperson. I volunteered but . . . . \_We should not expect to be called to present to the Board in the spring as anticipated last fall.

**ACAC Commissioner:** [Commissioner Bill Hendsbee](#) has experienced a significant increase in ACAC-related business this year. There has been an unusually high number of both eligibility rulings and disciplinary issues. [Bill has done a fine job to date and](#) has remained cognizant of Council's wishes that cases be disposed of in an expeditious fashion. He continues to do so in almost every case. You have received his report. At time of writing Bill and his family are vacationing in Greece and it is uncertain if he intends to return for another year. Subject to his evaluation, his intentions will be evident by the time of the AGM.

**ACAC Office Staffing:** The ACAC Office once again experienced a unique staffing situation [during the very busy September period](#) when [Erin's](#) unexpected two week [absence placed certain pressures on the Office operations as the new academic year approached and her departure immediately](#) again this year [after the Fall Council Meeting resulted in particular challenges. I am particularly pleased](#) with the job Anthony did in assisting me in carrying double duty during this most busy time of the year. We are thankful too for Erin's health as she has subsequently returned to the Office with her usual commitment and attention to detail.

Council should note Erin will leave the Conference at the end of June to prepare for the arrival of her and Brett's third child, expected the last half of July. Erin will enjoy a maternity leave during the 2008-9 season and is expected to return to the Conference in August, 2009. Replacements will be interviewed in early June with an anticipated August 18 start date. Owing to the timing of the replacement, I have requested and the Executive has agreed to bringing Anthony back two weeks early in mid-August to conduct orientation and training with the new EA. Anthony's contractual term will end April 30.

In addition, the ACAC Office is expected to enjoy the presence of summer student Irene Tang from May 12<sup>th</sup> to July 20. Irene (King's Basketball) worked with us as a summer student in 2007 and did a terrific job. We have a number of projects in mind for her including the creation of a detailed index for the back of the Operating Code.

As has been the case the past few years, the Office will be staffed for most of the summer, excepting the period of July 30 to August 10. We look forward to assisting you with any enquiries throughout the summer months.

Please accept this as my report for the period subsequent the May AGM. Thank you for your many contributions to making our jobs a little easier and more enjoyable to do.

In closing, I am pleased to offer special thanks to the Executive Committee for assisting us with so many important tasks during the course of the year. I wish to extend particular thanks to President Ellery Pullman, with whom I am in regular communication. Thanks too to you, our members who work to make the Alberta Colleges Athletic Conference the pre-eminent conference in Canada. Thank you.

## **Commissioner's Report Bill Hendsbee**

---

This marks the end of my second full year as Commissioner. Once again, I have enjoyed working with each of you over the last year. I am struck by the commission, passion and integrity of those who lead the Conference. Although issues continue to arise, they are dealt with in a professional and forthright manner that bodes well for our continued success.

My report of December 8, 2007 is attached for your reference. It dealt with significant issues that arose during the first half of this year, including a detailed review of the men's and women's soccer seasons.

Since my last report, the hockey disciplinary provisions of the Operating Code have been changed. All fights now count as game misconducts and count towards a player's game misconduct accumulation. In addition, any major penalty in the last 10 minutes of a game results in an automatic one game suspension. Finally, there are now automatic suspensions for aggressor/instigator penalties.

Taking into account the above changes, men's and women's hockey discipline totals were remarkably similar to those from the 2006-07 season.

Of note, men's basketball technical fouls were significantly lower this season, decreasing from 98 to 46).

Although there were certainly several disciplinary issues with athletes over the last year, the issue I would like to draw particular attention to relates to the conduct of coaches. It is not sport or school specific. In particular, the incidents involving NAIT men's basketball coach Chuma Nwobosi, MacEwan men's volleyball coach Brad Bell and Lethbridge women's basketball coach Brad Karren were particularly disturbing.

In previous reports I have spoken of the importance of maintaining a respectful relationship with our officials while also setting a positive example for our athletes. I appreciate that high level sports involve emotion and passion. However, our coaches and athletes must be made aware that future offences of a similar nature will be dealt with harshly by the Commissioner. Once again, I would like to stress that concerns with the performance or training of game officials should be dealt with through appropriate channels.

In conclusion, although we were faced with a number of challenges over the past year, I would like to thank each of you for helping to ensure that I was able to do my job effectively and fairly.
