HEAD COACH – WOMEN’S BASKETBALL

(PART-TIME POSITION)

Position Summary:

The chief responsibility for this position is to lead and develop the Women’s Basketball Program. The head coach must be of good character, representing Crandall University in a professional manner at all times. Other responsibilities include daily practices, games and tournaments. The coach must also actively participate in scheduling, recruitment of new players, supervision of assistant coaches, trainers and managers. The successful candidate will work alongside Student Development/Athletics Administrators to coordinate travel arrangements, budgets, and equipment/uniform purchases. The term for this position is the 2010/2011 season, effective immediately, with the opportunity for renewal.

Requirements of Successful Candidate:

- Technical, tactical, physical and psychological preparation of the team and athletes
- Flexibility in order to accommodate evening practices and weekend competition
- Providing direction and support to the student athletes in their pursuit of education and athletic goals
- A strong desire to disciple athletes to a closer relationship with Christ through athletics

Qualifications of Successful Candidate:

- NCCP Certification
- Experience coaching at the senior high, club or college/university level
- Exceptional interpersonal, communication and organizational skills
- Strong motivational abilities and a commitment to fair play

The competitive season begins in late October and ends with playoffs and the National Championship in March. The team practices 4-5 times per week. League play consists of 21 games.
